# Statements adopted by the Presidium

## January – October 2009

**Statement 1/2009<sup>1</sup> A common Nordic species databank to prevent the extermination of plant and animal species (A 1443/environment)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

to continue and deepen Nordic co-operation on the research and management aspects of monitoring nature; with a view amongst other things, to enable all countries to draw up and regularly update national red lists

to co-operate on and develop economic and legal tools and means of preserving the biological diversity of the countries

to co-operate on carefully monitoring the development of the occurrence of foreign, invasive species in the Nordic countries

to co-operate in international fora, including the Convention on Biological Diversity, the IUCN and the EU, to promote ambitious, global goal setting and to promote related means to preserve biological diversity beyond 2010.

**Statement 2/2009<sup>2</sup> Environmental policy for the Nordic Council and Nordic Council of Ministers (A 1442/environment and A 1446/presidium)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

that it completes an ambitious environment and climate policy for the Nordic Council of Ministers' own activities, as regards use of resources, energy consumption, waste management, principles for acquisition and purchase, travel, running of the secretariat and the institutions etc. by 31 December 2009 at the latest. that the environment and climate work be tailored to the specific needs of the organisation, and that it be organised in such a way that the starting points and goal setting for the various sub areas be defined, as well the method for follow up and monitoring of the achievement of the goals.

**Statement 3/2009<sup>3</sup> Development of initiatives against the dissemination of tuberculosis/multiple resistant tuberculosis and HIV/AIDS in Northwest Russia (A 1465/welfare)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

to continue the work with initiatives resulting from the conference "Interdepartmental Collaboration to Combat Communicable Diseases (HIV/TB) in Northwest Russia" and channelling the work through the Northern Dimension's partnership for health and quality of life, and the Expert Group on HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and multi-resistant tuberculosis

**Statement 4/2009<sup>4</sup> Wind farms in the Baltic Sea (A 1456/environment)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*to follow closely and further support the work with the assessing the international wind farm project in Kriegers Flak in the Baltic Sea*

*to draw up a wind atlas – possibly in co-operation with BASREC and the individual countries around the Baltic Sea – to examine the potential in establishing large wind farms in a number of suitable locations in the Baltic Sea and to establish combined, general performance regional transmission solutions in this connection*

**Statement 5/2009<sup>5</sup> Better emergency repairs for the Nordic electricity network (A 1457/environment)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*to establish a closer co-operation on emergency planning and repairs for the Nordic electricity sector and to ensure that these emergency services are more firmly established with the authorities and that there are national goals for the work*

**Statement 6/2009<sup>6</sup> Nordic embassy co-operation (A 1448/presidium)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the governments of the Nordic countries

*to increase co-operation between the Nordic countries, both in the form of premises as area of responsibility, in regard to consular and diplomatic presence in other nations and on other continents*

**Statement 7/2009<sup>7</sup> Nordic action plan for staff and user-driven innovation in the Nordic globalisation strategy (A 1462/business)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers,

*that in the Nordic action plan for innovation and commercial policies 2010 - 2013 the Nordic Council of Ministers focuses on:*

- *a strong interaction between businesses, researchers, consumers and producers on experiences and the development potential for staff and user-driven innovation with particular focus on developing better welfare services and climate and energy solutions*
- *determines the needs and opportunities for, as well as initiate, research co-operation in the Nordic countries in specific areas for staff and user-driven innovation*
- *contributes, in co-operation with labour market partners, to developing opportunities for a culture in Nordic work places which promotes staff and user-driven innovation*

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers,	
1) <i>that</i> the funding for 2-2251-2 the Art and Culture Programme be increased by DKK 1,000,000

<b>Rec. 9/2009</b>	<b>More resource-friendly fishing and a ban on fish dumping (A 1471/environment)</b>
The Nordic Council recommends to the governments of the Nordic countries,	
<i>to work for a joint Nordic initiative for the current revision of the EU's Common Fisheries Policy; initiatives which build on regulations which strengthen profitable and legal fishing on the basis of the sustainability of individual fish stocks – for example, minimising dumping, greater control of illegal fishing, establishing closed areas for breeding, ensuring profitability in the industry and improved framework conditions for coastal fishing as well as the question of regionalisation of fisheries management.</i>	
<i>to work for, within the framework of the existing common fisheries policy, to minimise the level of dumping to an absolute minimum through immediately winding up or re-structuring the inappropriate EU quota systems which involve an unacceptable waste of resources and potential food</i>	
<i>to, in connection with the work for the EU's future Baltic Sea strategy, introduce a temporary effective stop on dumping of fish in the Baltic Sea</i>	

<b>Rec. 10/2009</b>	<b>An international conference on developments in the Arctic region, A 1459/presidium</b>
The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers,	
<i>to in co-operation with the Presidency of the Arctic Council, and with the involvement of Nordic and Arctic MPs, to organise an international conference on developments in the Arctic Region</i>	

<b>Rec. 11/2009</b>	<b>Access to civil registration numbers during temporary stays in a Nordic country – co-ordination of national civil registration numbers ( A 1470/citizens)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the governments of the Nordic countries,</p> <p><i>to ensure co-ordination of a national civil registration number system so that Nordic citizens can use their national civil registration number during temporary stays in other Nordic countries on an equal footing with the host country's registration numbers.</i></p>	

<b>Rec. 12/2009</b>	<b>Access to civil registration numbers during temporary stays in a Nordic country – development of an identification system ( A 1470/citizens)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers</p> <p><i>to investigate the possibility of developing an identification system for internet trading, whereby companies can obtain information on civil registration numbers to be able to guarantee identity</i></p>	

<b>Rec. 13/2009</b>	<b>Action Plan for the energy sector 2010 – 2013 (B 262/environment)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers</p> <p><i>to ensure co-operation between the Nordic countries to target the countries' "crisis packages" against initiatives that reduce emissions of climate gases in the short and the long term in the most environmentally effective way; amongst other things concrete programmes to promote energy renovations in housing and buildings; including public buildings</i></p> <p><i>to carry out concrete collaboration projects in connection with the implementation in the Nordic countries of the EU's directive for renewable energy; including investigating opportunities for co-operation on a green electricity certificate</i></p> <p><i>to work to strengthen regional energy co-operation in the Baltic Sea area in agreement with the recommendations from the 18th Baltic Sea Parliamentary Conference and the underlying work group report</i></p> <p><i>to implement the Council of Ministers' Proposal B 262/environment for the "Action Programme 2010-2013 for the energy sector" involving the views that are expressed in the Nordic Council's current recommendation on the proposal</i></p>	

<b>Rec. 14/2009</b>	<b>Nordic competency bank in the environment and energy sectors (A 1463/business)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers</p> <p><i>that a full-scale project which develops models for further dissemination of research results within the EU/EEA, ought to be initiated as part of the Top-Level Research Initiative to create (free) access to research results to allow the Nordic countries to be a leading region in the EU/EEA</i></p>	

<b>Rec. 15/2009</b>	<b>Establishment of a Nordic office in Minsk, Belarus ( A 1435/presidium)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers</p> <p><i>to establish a Nordic information office in Minsk, Belarus</i></p>	

<b>Rec. 16/2009</b>	<b>Concentrated efforts for a joint Nordic defence, (A 1455/presidium)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the governments of the Nordic countries</p> <p><i>to work to develop closer co-operation on defence and security policy in the Nordic Region</i></p>	

<b>Rec. 17/2009</b>	<b>Co-operation on space exploration (A 1464/business)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers</p> <p><i>to take initiative to improve ventures, including R&amp;D ventures, in space activities to develop better environment and resource monitoring of the northern areas and the Arctic to have better co-ordination and assessment of the activities taking place</i></p> <p><i>to assess if surveillance data can be made readily available between the Nordic countries than is the case today</i></p>	

<b>Rec. 18/2009</b>	<b>Migration, asylum and refugee policies: A formal area of co-operation in the Nordic Council of Ministers (A 1479/citizens)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers</p> <p><i>that the policy areas of migration, asylum and refugees become a formal area of co-operation in the Nordic Council of Ministers that Migration, asylum and refugee affairs will thus be processed equally by the relevant Nordic ministers with responsibility for the policy areas with a view to creating a humanitarian and sustainable migration to and from the Nordic countries</i></p>	

<b>Rec. 19/2009</b>	<b>Children as victims of human trafficking (A 1449/citizens)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers</p> <p><i>to draw up a Nordic action plan to prevent children becoming victims of human trafficking, and thus underline the importance of respecting and following the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child</i></p> <p><i>to present a proposal to reduce the demand for buying sexual favours</i></p> <p><i>to proposals will combat all forms of trade with children, including illegal adoption and purchase and sale of infants and children, that are victims of organ trade</i></p> <p><i>that the national authorities co-operate with the NGOs, associations and companies that are active in the area with a view to finding creative and effective solutions to the problems</i></p> <p><i>that the authorities are aware of abuse in the asylum and immigration systems where children arrive in the country or are granted residence permits under false identities or for the wrong reasons</i></p> <p><i>that the interests of the child must be weighed highest, even if the child is living illegally in the country</i></p>	

<b>Rec. 20/2009</b>	<b>Strong joint Nordic action against drugs (A 1467/citizens)</b>
<p>The Nordic Council recommends to the governments of the Nordic countries,</p> <p><i>to work for zero-tolerance on drug dealing in the Nordic countries, where the police, customs and authorities have different strategies to implement this</i></p>	

**Rec. 21/2009                      Joint Nordic strategy against drugs and project research (A 1467/citizens)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*to* adopt a joint Nordic strategy against drugs

*to* support and initiate project research on the reasons for young people starting to use intoxicating substances

*to* co-ordinate the national initiatives for the prevention and treatment of drug abuse *that* the purpose is to focus on "best practice" with regard to reducing the number of addicts most effectively

**Rec. 22/2009                      Increased research co-operation in and about the northern region (A 1474/culture)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*to* promote Nordic network models such as "*Centres of Excellence*" and use them as spearheads for making the Nordic Region a competence-based region and strengthen "*Cross Border*" co-operation by linking projects and project funding to this kind of network co-operation

*to* bring a northern priority to Nordic research schools and scholarship schemes which adds weight by developing and drawing attention to the Nordic region with experts on the conditions in the Nordic region

*to* strengthen mobility schemes with a northern priority to further develop the Nordic region as a goal for students and researchers from other regions and to take note of the opportunities to use the *University of the Arctic's GoNorth* initiative for this purpose

**Rec. 23/2009                      Nordic research on polar low pressure (A 1472/culture)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*to* increase research on how polar low pressure occurs and how to ensure advance warning of this through a closer meteorological co-operation between the Nordic countries based on a common goal of being able to prevent accidents happening in the vulnerable areas

**Rec. 24/2009**                      **Culture in schools ( A 1469/culture)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the governments of the Nordic countries

*that* the ministers of culture and education adopt a common declaration that children and young people in the whole Nordic Region should have access to creative subjects in school, partly in cultural schools that offer teaching in the creative subjects

*that* resources are allocated for common Nordic research in teaching methods and development that promote the progress of creative competences

*that* children with special needs for support are offered unbroken teaching which includes creative subjects

*that* the Nordic ministers of education ensure that all creative subjects, including dance and drama are boosted in teacher training

*that* resources are allocated for a joint Nordic campaign/marketing for the cultural school concept for municipalities and other relevant players

*that* a pilot project is set up with one or two weeks of class exchange across the Nordic Region with a view to achieving language and cultural solidarity  
*that* the project will help to develop a joint Nordic strategy for "Culture in School" through:

underlining the importance of the positive influence that the creative / musical subjects have in the community and solidarity in schools and the surrounding society

**Rec. 25/2009**                      **Nordic co-operation on small trades and crafts/cultural skills ( A 1473/culture)**

Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*that* the Nordic Council of Ministers creates a common database, based on the Nordic model, in which all Nordic trades can be registered, including tradesmen, apprentices and companies

*that* the relevant authorities in the countries ensure that apprentices who want to, have the opportunity to take on a two-year study/work experience stay in another Nordic country, and have the opportunity to take their financial support with them, i.e. a taximeter system for student financing as well as a transport funding system

*that* a binding co-operation in the educational sector is established in these areas, in which the business community and cultural life are active partners

*that* a co-operative body is established as recommended in the report "Spor i Norden"

**Rec. 26/2009**                      **Restructuring of Scandinavian Institute of Dental Materials (NIOM) to a co-operative body by 1.1.2010 (B 264/welfare)**

Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*to* restructure the Scandinavian Institute of Dental Materials (NIOM) to a co-operative body with effect by 1.1.2010 as described in the Council of Ministers' proposal B 264/welfare

**Rec. 27/2009**                      **An inclusive and sustainable working life in the Nordic Region  
(A 1480/welfare)**

Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*to* develop parameters for the concept "a sustainable working life", which will be able to document the development of working life in the Nordic Region on an annual basis

*to* take the initiative for a broad, multi-disciplinary conference on youth unemployment in the Nordic Region. The conference will illustrate the factors that influence joblessness for young people in the Nordic countries. The conference should conclude with a report which will sum up the experiences which have been exchanged and contain proposals for initiatives to reduce youth unemployment in the short and the long term

*to* improve mobility in the Nordic countries by speeding up efforts to break down barriers for Nordic citizens who wish to work/study and establish work places across Nordic borders

*to* take initiatives for a report to look at ways of developing a more inclusive working life. It is a working life has its starting point with people and people's needs, which is accommodating so that people can remain in work, and so that the resources and capacity for work of the individual is developed and used. The report will also propose new initiatives to reduce the negative development of more and more people being left out of the community and labour market

*to* take the initiative for a Nordic seminar which will illustrate the connection between demographic development, the need for labour immigration, an inclusive working life and the need for older people to stay longer at work. It will also illustrate the advantages and disadvantages of raising retirement age, or making it more flexible than it is today from a social and health perspective, and look at the possible human and social-economic benefits

**Rec. 28/2009**                      **Consumer policy networks  
(A 1478/citizens)**

Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*to* create a Nordic network with representatives from organisations, associations, authorities and the business community, which engage themselves with consumer policies. The network will seek a joint Nordic approach to European and international consumer policies, find solutions border obstacles for consumers, co-ordinate national consumer legislation and strengthen rights in the Nordic countries

*to* set up a project for the purpose of supporting the consumer network, so that the network can meet often and hold conferences. The Project will be administered by part-time project employees, who can be associated with another portfolio, either under the auspices of the Nordic Council of Ministers' Secretariat or through the participants in the network

**Rec. 29/2009**                      **Traffic infrastructure in the Mid-Nordic Region (A  
1458/business)**

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*to* initiate a survey of the initiatives and projects for the traffic infrastructure in the Mid-Nordic Region to look for possible areas of co-operation

Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*that* efforts and activities for volunteers and the amateur sector be explicitly entered as an independent area with its own budget in the Nordic Council of Ministers future strategy and action plan for 2010-2012

*that* continuity and balance are maintained in cultural co-operation, so that recurrent projects such as theatre days and festivals, or established cultural institutions can receive funding more than three times in a row

*that* application procedures are simplified and that it is looked into whether funding programmes from Nordic Culture Point and the Culture Fund can be co-ordinated to avoid double expenditure for experts and double administration of applications

*that* the relatively small amount of funding available for Nordic culture should contribute to promoting real breadth in Nordic cultural co-operation, so that the main focus is placed on a clear Nordic dimension and breadth of projects funded through the Nordic Council of Ministers' programmes

*that* there should be a more permanent representation from the Nordic artist and cultural life at the Nordic Cultural Forum, so that there is a chance to have better coherence from forum to forum For example, 1/4 or 1/3 permanent participants and corresponding different participants, who are invited according to the theme. There may be, for example, 3-4 annual nominations from the Nordic Artists' Council and other players

*that* at the time of distributing project funding there must be a clear division between, on the one side the level of the senior officials and project secretariats, and on the other side the experts' professional and independent cultural expertise and assessment. The two parts must be separated so that the arm's length principle can be maintained

*that* expert groups and their degree of freedom is scrutinized and amended to guarantee the groups' independence and professionalism, the depth and breadth of the composition and expertise, including more transparency around the choice of experts

*that* Nordic cultural co-operation is built to a high degree on informal networks, which have come into being over time and which are particularly important for the continued understanding of Nordic solidarity The Nordic Council of Ministers' funding programme, to a higher degree, ought to support these networks and thus qualify and draw attention to them, rather than primarily focusing on new networks

The Nordic Council recommends to the Nordic Council of Ministers

*that* it investigates and maps out the connection between copyright and the experience economy, including the degree to which the technological development affects the increase in value for artists and the intellectual property businesses

*that* a platform is created that guarantees a dialogue between politicians, artists, producers, consumers and other interested parties in the area of intellectual property, and which facilitates that the parties themselves agree and administer the business models and aim to guarantee an effective protection of the intellectual property rights of the artists and the producers by reducing the scope of intellectual property on the Internet

*that* establishes a parallel monitoring and approval of legislation in the area of intellectual property and rule of law in the Nordic countries, and in relation to the EU, with the aim of harmonising legislation

*that* information campaigns are planned and started, aimed at schools and children and young people, as well as consumer organisations, to provide information on the importance of intellectual property, and about the consequences for artists, owners of the rights and for society in general

*that* it is investigated, if it there is an opportunity to set up an independent council or body at national level, possibly in the form of an already existing public body, that will have the opportunity, via direct letters, to contact the major offenders with information about illegal activities in connection with them, which they should stop or do something about (the internet providers or telephone companies should NOT conduct this surveillance)

*that* the above-mentioned at-clauses take into consideration and respect that the Internet today is of crucial significance for freedom of expression of citizens and internet users, and their ability to participate in society

The Nordic Council recommends to the governments of the Nordic countries

*that*, in continuation of the existing funding scheme for computer games, *Nordic Game Program*, a permanent Nordic public funding system for computer game developers be established, in line with the funding schemes that exist for films

*that* existing national/EU funding schemes and pools (the Danish Film Institute, *New Media Desk*, the Norwegian Film Institute and Finnish *Neogames*) be included in the new permanent, Nordic funding structure

*that* they define computer games on the players' own terms, as cultural products in line with film, TV and theatre, which should naturally and permanently be included and supported by culture polices (films receive permanent funding from the Nordic Film &TV Fund)

*that* they formulate a common, Nordic cultural policy for computer games, that can be linked with educational and business policy goals

*that* they promote Nordic games that are different, that are based on Nordic/European language and cultural traditions, and which act as an alternative to the large American and Japanese companies commercial agenda in games and console producers

*that* they promote educational offers to Nordic game developers across the Nordic countries

*that* they chart and co-ordinate game research at Nordic level, including guaranteeing that there an understanding of eSport and healthy game habits for children and young people

*that* they as quickly as possible start up a report that is carried out by the director/project manager of *Nordic Game Program*, with the aim of surveying, deciding, and then implementing, permanent Nordic funding programmes for computer games, for example, under the auspices of the Nordic Film & TV Fund, which will, not least, guarantee the growth of small Nordic developers, who need approval for their first projects/prototypes
