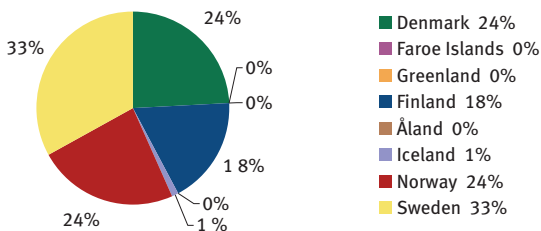

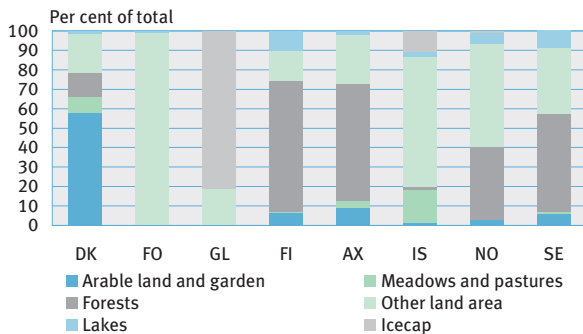

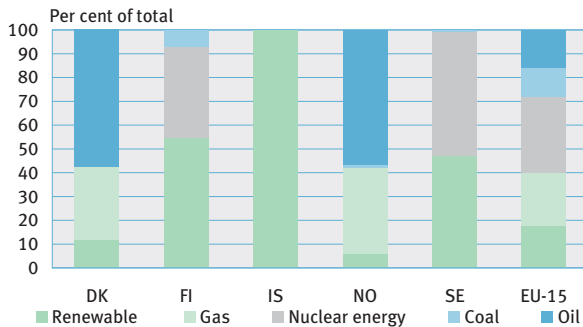

Land use. 2008



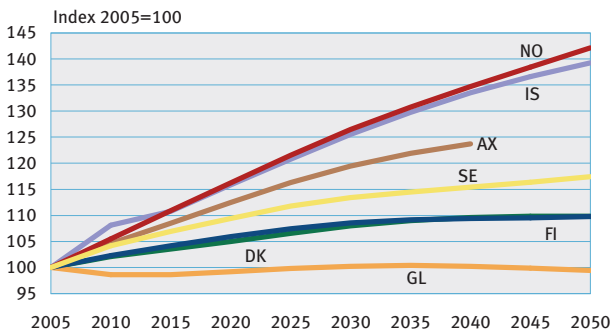
Indigenous energy production. 2007

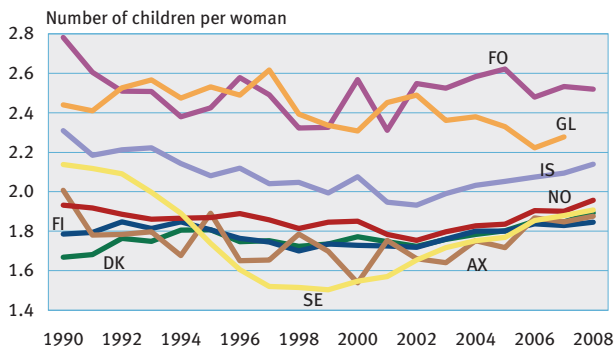

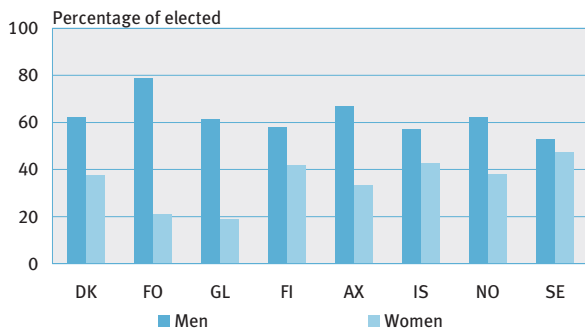

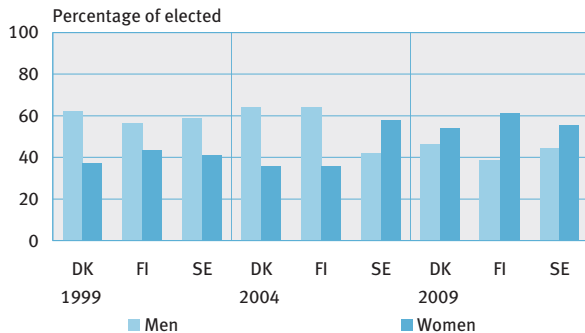

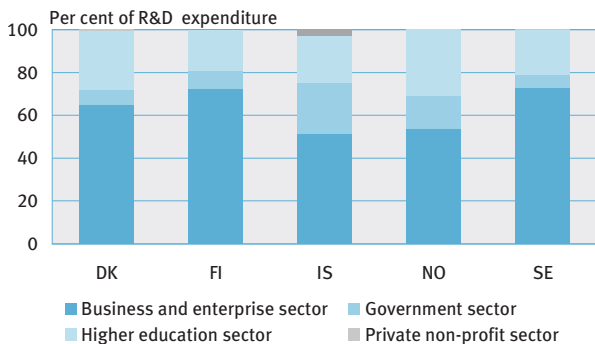

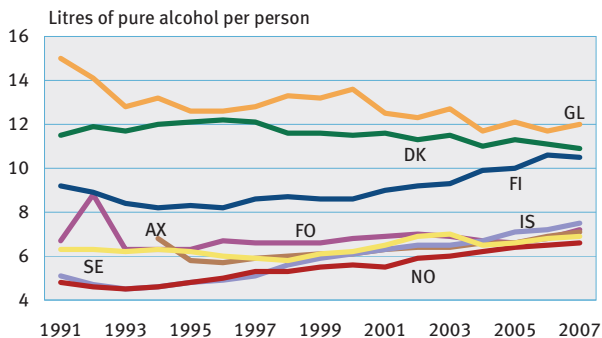

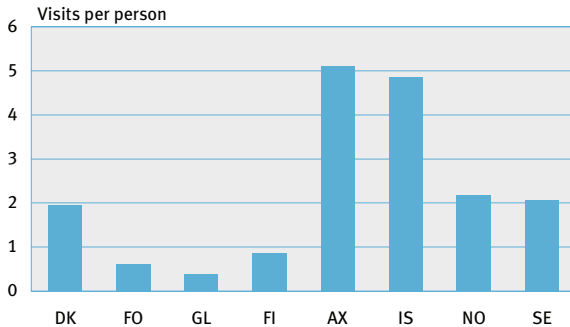

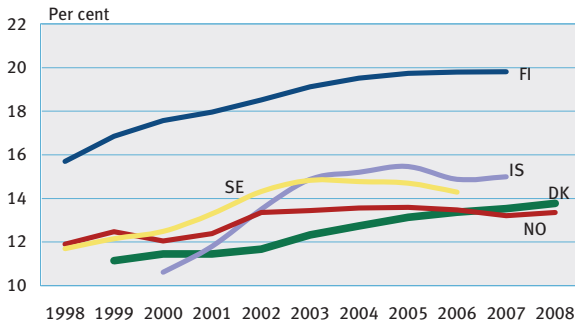

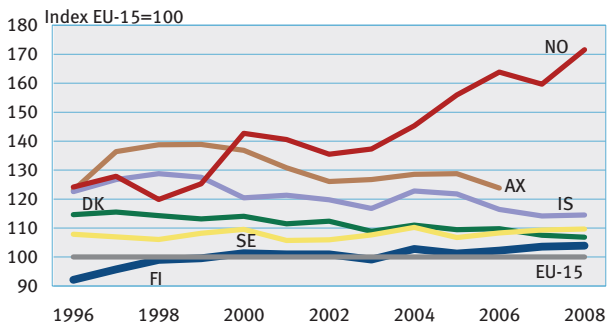

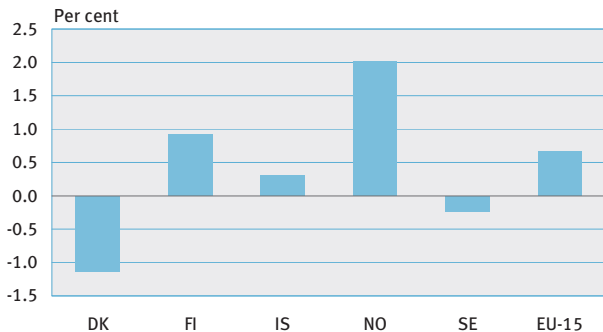

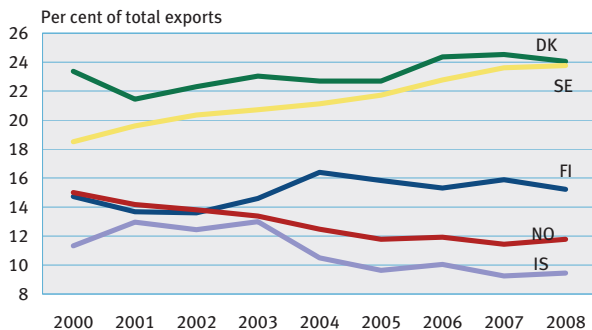
Gross domestic product per person in euro (PPP)



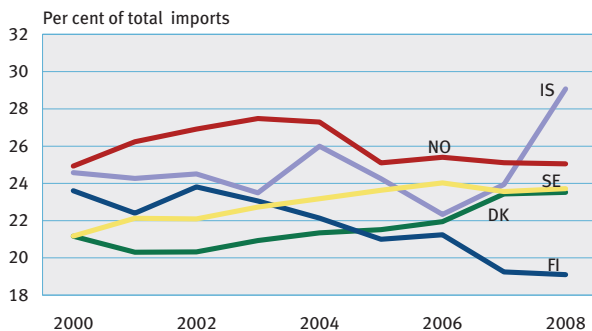
Gross domestic product, real annual growth. 2008

The Nordic countries' imports from other Nordic countries

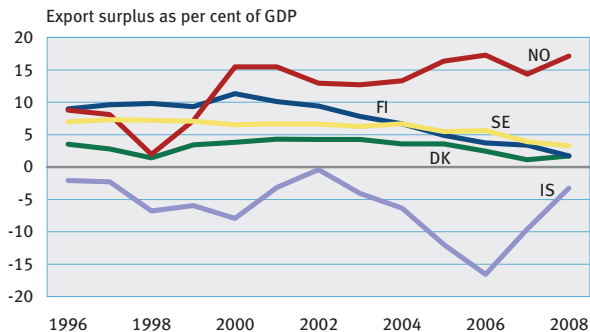


Nordic exports in percent of total export. 2008

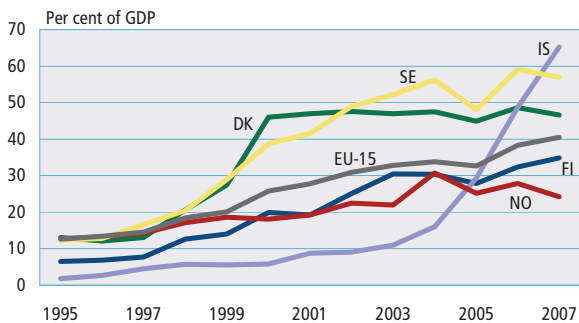

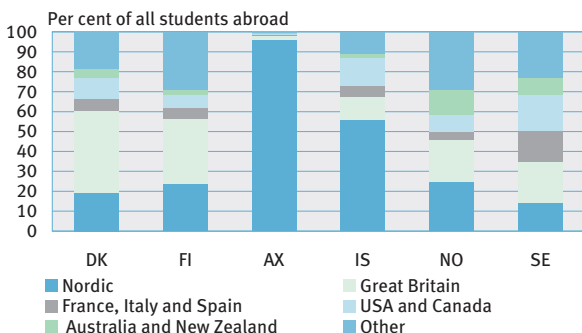
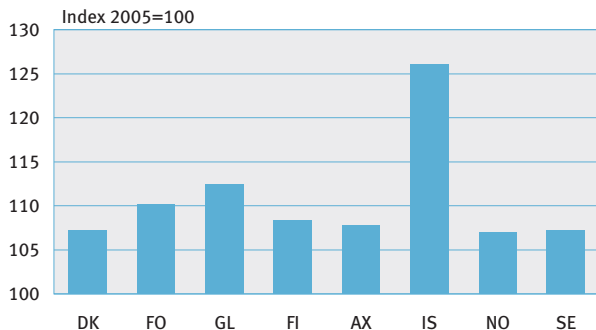

Trade balance of goods



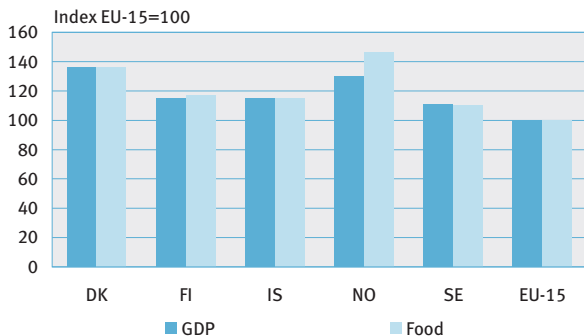
Foreign direct investment – inwards



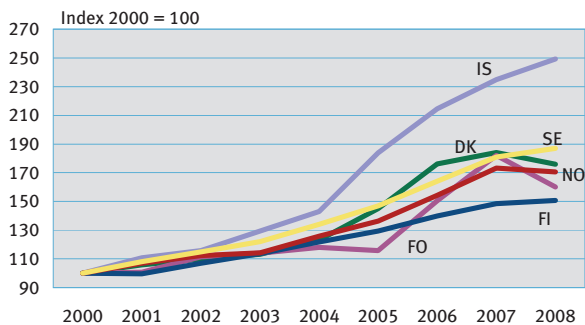
Nordic students abroad. 2007/08**Consumer price index. 2008**

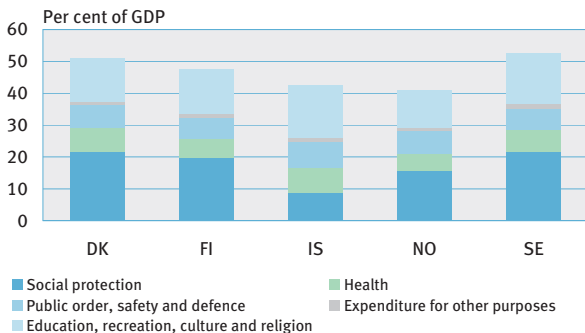
Price levels. 2008



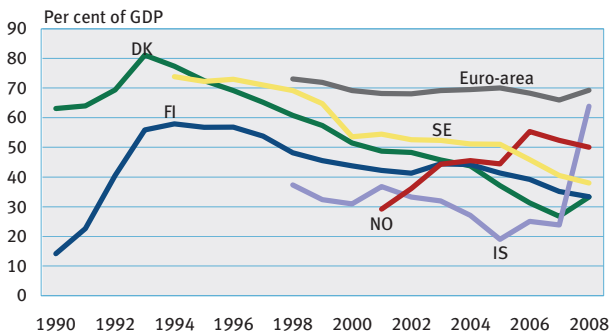
House price index



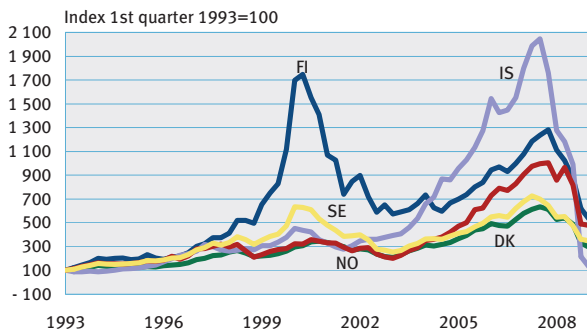
General government expenditure by purpose. 2007



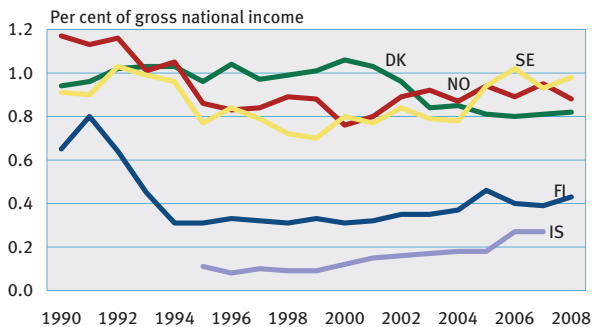
General government gross debt



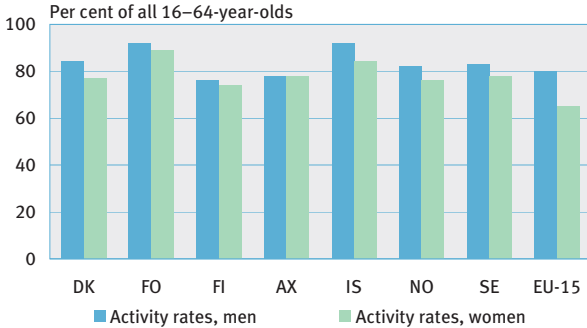

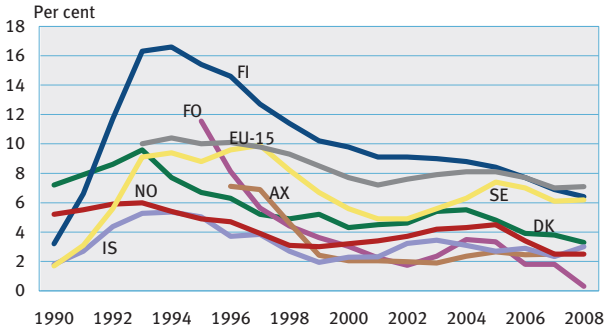


Activity rates by sex, 2008

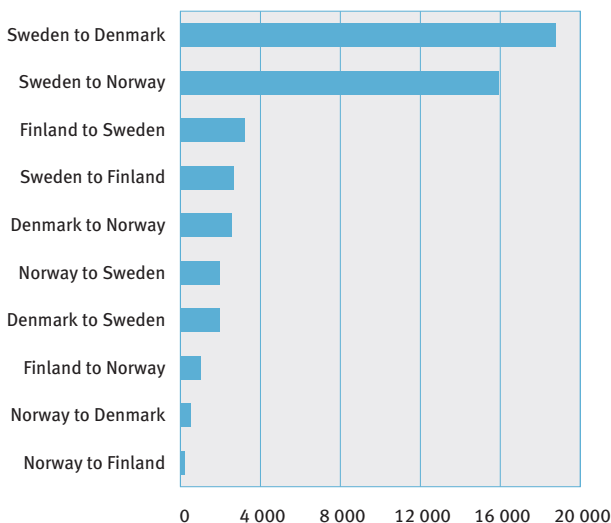
